Integrity – We are committed to the highest professional and ethical standards. We are accountable for our actions to the community and each other. We foster public trust by being honest, fair, and consistent.



TIPS FOR HOME SECURITY

EXTERIOR

Landscaping

Shrubby and trees should be cut and maintained to not block the view of doorways and windows. Don't give burglars a place to hide.



Lighting

Burglars don't like well-lit areas. Install exterior security lights. You can put them on a timer or motion detection. Eliminate blind spots.



Visible Address

Your house number should be clearly seen from the street. Use reflective numbers or stickers and make them large enough.



911 Address Signs, like the ones pictured above, are ideal. They can be purchased at the Garland Rescue Squad or J & D Sports.

Interior

Doors

All exterior doors should be solid core, with deadbolts, and 3 inch screws in the strikeplates. Also, 180 degree peepholes should be installed on all exterior doors.



Windows

Windows should be of high impact glass or have a covering installed to prevent breaking apart. Also, utilizing auxiliary or secondary locking systems can prevent the window from being pried open.



The window shown above was fitted with security tint which prevented the glass from shattering.
